Charlotte, NC – The School of Nursing's Associate Dean put it succinctly: "April Davis is an amazing educator and teammate." April Davis has been a nurse for 26 years and has shared her passion for nursing by serving Carolinas HealthCare System for 19 years and Carolinas College of Health Sciences (CCHS) for 17 of those. April is an innovative instructor. Her creativity and curriculum insight were instrumental in revamping the Nursing Fundamentals class so that students are better prepared for clinical success in their first semester. She has spent hours applying technology solutions to the fundamentals class, making the class easier for students to complete at their own pace and place. This delivery method is helpful to and popular with students facing unexpected schedule demands. She has also explored using webcams and software applications to teach simultaneously in two classrooms.

A highly effective communicator, April builds consensus and trust through collaborative, respectful listening and negotiating skills. At the same time, she does not shy away from crucial conversations, but is careful to preserve the dignity of others—even in conflict—by applying thoughtful and holistic communication skills.

Service to students is a cornerstone of her higher education philosophy. In addition to tutoring, advising, and teaching, she recently accepted the honor of advising the Student Nurses Association. She served as a coach during the recent college phone-a-thon, and she spends her personal time offering free yoga classes for college employees, students and the community.

April is also an active member of the Association of Operating Room Nurses, Dogwood Chapter, and has served in many official capacities both locally and nationally. She is a member of Mu Psi chapter of Sigma Theta Tau, National League of Nurses, and the American Nurses Association.
