Medical Laboratory Professionals Week is an annual celebration of the laboratory professionals who play a vital role in every aspect of healthcare. Since they often work behind the scenes, few people know about the critical testing they perform every day. Lab week is a time to honor the more than 300,000 medical laboratory professionals around the world who prepare, perform and interpret more than 10 billion laboratory tests in the US every year. Over 70% of medical decisions are based on lab results.

#### WELCOME!

Demetra Castillo, M.Ad.Ed., MLS(ASCP) CM is the new program chair of the school of Clinical Laboratory Sciences. She is a highly accomplished and proficient medical laboratory scientist with almost 20 years of experience in medical laboratory science clinical practice and education. She is originally from Chicago, where she received her bachelor's degree in medical technology (now medical laboratory science) from Rush University. She started working in the core laboratory as a student and continued after she graduated, where she was cross trained in hematology, chemistry, and immunoserology. She obtained a masters' degree in adult education from National Louis University after finding her passion for teaching students in their clinical practica. Shortly after graduating, she obtained a faculty position at her alma mater where she was the course director and practicum coordinator for hematology, coagulation, education, and research. She is currently a PhD candidate in health sciences, working on educational leadership in medical laboratory science programs. She has served on clinical and educational interprofessional teams promoting the medical laboratory profession, with her most recent venture creating and delivering an educational program for Chinese physicians treating hemophilia patients in Guangzhou, China. She

serves on advisory boards for several graduate MLS programs and is a site visitor and paper reviewer for the National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Science programs. She has received numerous accolades from her students, as well as local, state, and national organizations. She has been an invited speaker at local, regional, national, and international venues. She believes that the medical laboratory science profession has a critical role on the healthcare team, and will continue to advocate for her students, program, and the profession to promote interprofessional team-

work and leadership. On a personal level, Demetra comes from Greek parents, and is

married with three children and lives in the Fort Mill area.

#### **MOVING ON ... BUT NOT OUT**



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## **Techniques to Prepare for Exams**

- 1. Start studying early, reviewing a portion of the course material each day.
- 2. Maintain balance in your life with exercise, a healthy diet and sufficient sleep.

3. Don't just hope you know it: KNOW you know it by pre-testing yourself. Use practice test questions and scenarios or create them and test yourself alone or with a study buddy. Better yet, teach the material to your buddy and answer follow-up questions. If you can teach it, you probably know it.

4. Create a testing affirmation for yourself. Attitude is everything, and you can do a lot to create a winning attitude to take into your testing room. Develop an affirming statement such as, "I'm capable, I'm prepared, and I'm ready to blow this test out of the water!" Repeat it to yourself regularly, using it to replace negative thoughts.

**BCLS for the HealthCare Provider. April 26**, 8 AM to noon. Cost \$50. Textbook included. This course is designed for professional rescuers or students required to have professional rescuer certification for their healthcare program of study. The course provides information on adult and pediatric CPR, two-rescuer scenarios, use of the bagvalve mask, foreign-body airway obstruction (conscious and unconscious), AED, special resuscitation situations, and other cardiopulmonary emergencies.
