To make an appointment:

BCLS for the Healthcare Provider August 16, 8 AM to noon. Cost \$50. Textbook not included. This course is designed for professional rescuers or students required to have professional rescuer certification for their healthcare program of study. The course provides information on adult and pediatric CPR, two-rescuer scenarios, use of the bag-valve mask, foreign-body airway obstruction (conscious and unconscious), AED, special resuscitation situations, and other cardiopulmonary emergencies. Heartcode BLS Online Program Cost \$28.50 (Online payment required - cannot register via brochure.) Access the American Heart Association website by typing in the web address: <u>www.onlineaha.org</u>. Choose HeartCode BLS. The course takes approximately two hours and must be taken before attending the Heartcode BLS Online Skills Check. The test has to be completed in one sitting. Print the Course Completion Certificate to bring to Heartcode BCLS Online Skills Check Part 2.

Heartcode BLS Online Skills Check August 2, 9, 16, 23 & 30 1 to 3 PM. Cost \$25.00. You must bring the Part 1 Course Completion Certificate (Passing) to Part 2. Be ready to check off on all BLS Skills. Complete skills check (Part 2) within 60 days of completion of online BLS (Part 1).

Stress Management (Multiple Webinar Dates) August 8 (9 to 10 AM); August 16 (Noon to 1 PM); August 24 (1 to 2 PM). Goals of the webinar: 1) Define stress and understand your sources of stress; 2) Understand the effects of stress on the body; 3) Learn strategies to reduce stress in your daily life. Inhaled Clinical Aromatherapy Class August 9, 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. Cost \$105. 0.2 CEUs equivalent to 2.0 contact hours. This 2-hour class is part of the required foundation for offering clinical inhalation aromatherapy training in the healthcare setting. Participants will learn the background, safety, benefits and practical application of essential oils used within Carolinas HealthCare System. Upon completion of this training class and after showing proof of having completed the PeopleLink e-learning module titled "Inhaled Clinical Aromatherapy," ICACs will have the credentials to be able to validate other teammate's competency as an Inhaled Clinical Aromatherapy Provider (ICAP) on their unit.

Healing Touch Level I August 26-27, 8:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Cost \$295 (student rate). 18 contact hours for nurses and massage therapists. Healing touch is an energy-based therapy in which practitioners consciously use their hands in a heart-centered and intentional way to support and facilitate physical, emotional, mental and spiritual health. The goal of healing touch is to restore balance in the human energy system. This is a program of study offered by the national Healing Touch Program. (www.healingtouchprogram.com).

Introduction to Integrative Practices August 31, September 14 & 28, October 12. Graduation November 30. 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Location: CHS-Northeast, Clinical Services Bldg., Room 3335. Cost \$295. 2.4 CEUs equivalent to 24 class hours. This course provides clinicians and non-clinicians with an introduction to evidenced-based holistic and integrative practices to help create comfort and enhance the patient and family's medical care. Also included are HANDS-ON experiences in the classroom and an integrative project to be completed. The course consists of four modules: Introduction to Integrative Practices and Self-care; Holistic Presence and Aromatherapy; Mindfulness (which includes relaxation breathing techniques and guided imagery); Energy and Manual Medicine and Integrative Practicum.
