The process has been changed this year in that you are now able to complete the application via Survey Monkey (www.surveymonkey.com/r/9FCQ35Z). The application deadline date is **April 14, 2017**. **Financial Aid -** Any student interested in or who will be using financial aid for fall 2017 must complete the 2017-2018 FAFSA. The 2017-2018 FAFSA can be completed now using your 2015 tax return. Please visit www.fafsa.gov. Carolinas College's school code: 031042.

**Important Requirement for Any Student Returning for the 2017-2018 School Year and Applying for Financial Aid** - The State of North Carolina has changed its method of determining residency for purposes of state financial aid. In the past, residency has been determined by each campus now that determination will no longer be made by the campus but instead will be made by the State through its Residency Determination Service (RDS) website (<u>https://www.ncresidency.org</u>). To assure your eligibility for state aid, please visit the RDS website at your earliest opportunity. Once you have a determination made through the RDS website, it will last as long as you remain continuously enrolled. You will no longer have to do this every year.

**Now Hiring Immediately: Federal Work Study Positions -** Students employed through the Federal Work Study Program (FWS) provide support in one or more of the various departments of the college. Applicants must be current-ly enrolled for a mini- mum of six credit hours, be in good standing with CHS and the college, have a completed current year (2015-16) Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on file, and meet federal FWS eligibility guide-lines. ### **COMPLIANCE CORNER - Hand Hygiene Observers**

Simple, basic hand hygiene is a powerful component in infection prevention and control. Decreasing the spread of infection is of primary importance to Carolinas HealthCare System (CHS). CHS utilizes hand hygiene observers to randomly round units within the hospital to observe teammate compliance with hand hygiene procedures. Hand hygiene should be used when entering a patient's room, even if you do not touch anything in the process, and after leaving a

patient's room. Hand hygiene observers do not document anything they cannot see . If you bring supplies into a patient room, put them down and do hand hygiene before you provide care, it will not be considered an observation.

Important reminders:

- So Hand hygiene is required before and after use of gloves.
- If your patient is in an isolation room, you MUST wash your hands before donning protective equipment, and after you take it off.

### After the Exam

When a test is returned, do a test-error analysis. Analyze why the wrong answers are wrong (e.g., didn't know the information, misread the question, made a mathematical error). Ask the instructor or a tutor about any questions you don't understand. Ask yourself the following questions after taking your exam:

- In what ways was the exam similar to what I expected?
- ✓ In what ways was the exam different from what I expected?
- ✓ What part of my preparation helped me most?
- ✓ What should I have done but didn't?
- ✓ What percentage of the questions were drawn from class notes, the text, or other sources?
- ✓ What study skills should I work on to prepare for the next test?
- ✓ If possible, meet with your professor for help. Arrive prepared with questions. Approach the meeting with a positive attitude. Look for ways to improve for the next exam.

Decide which study habits worked well and which didn't and work to improve weaker skills. Make an appointment with your advisor or Sam Smith, Student Success Coordinator, 704.355.4025.

**BCLS for the HealthCare Provider. March 29**, 8 AM to noon. Cost \$50. Textbook included. This course is designed for professional rescuers or students required to have professional rescuer certification for their healthcare program of study. The course provides information on adult and pediatric CPR, two-rescuer scenarios, use of the bagvalve mask, foreign-body airway obstruction (conscious and unconscious), AED, special resuscitation situations, and other cardiopulmonary emergencies.
