Each online registration date will open at 7:30 a.m.

Attention: All students must meet with their advisor and have their "online registration hold" lifted prior to every semester. If you do not meet with your advisor, the hold will not be lifted.

- ONLINE REGISTRATION for nursing (AAS & RN-BSN) and radiologic technology students only begins June 10.
- ONLINE REGISTRATION continues for above programs but now includes all General Studies students, including prenursing and pre-radiologic technology track students begins **June 17**.
- OPEN ONLINE REGISTRATION continues for all programs and departments begins June 24.

Please Note: Medical Laboratory Science, Histotechnology and Radiation Therapy students will be registered for their next sequence of classes by the registrar. There is no action needed on your part.

TEAMMATE/PROGRAM ACCOLADES



Tracy Hayes

Congratulations to Tracy Hayes, the 2019 Outstanding Educator. Tracy graduated from Pennsylvania State University with her bachelor of science in nursing in 1998. In 2001, she moved to the Charlotte area and joined Carolinas Healthcare System as a pediatric nurse. Ms. Hayes began her career at Carolinas College of Health Science in 2008 as a part-time clinical faculty member for Nursing 153 – Child and Adolescent Health. In 2013, she graduated from the University of North Carolina Charlotte with her master's degree in nursing education. She then transitioned into a full-time faculty position for Nursing 153 in 2014. Ms. Hayes is PALS certified, as well as a certified pediatric nurse, and completed an online teaching certification in 2018.

Ms. Hayes is an effective communicator with her students and her peers. In the classroom she creates a positive environment for the students to learn. She consistently receives positive evaluations from her students. Students have noted that "Tracy is an amazing clinical instructor and was always available to help, she made me think and find answers on my own which helped me learn" and "I LOVED WHEN TRACY taught. Somehow, she made the information stick in my brain and made me see what was important. She is severely consistent in her teaching skills and it makes knowing what is important easier. Also allows us to think like a nurse."

Beyond the instructional settings, Ms. Hayes is an engaged and innovative faculty member, never satisfied with the status quo. She has utilized information gleaned from her online certification to improve the learning experience for students. Ms. Hayes has taken initiative to organize faculty to explore the consistency of test items across the nursing curriculum. She has been instrumental in exploring a curriculum change that will allow the program to accept and graduate more students, as well as enhance their learning experiences. Ms. Hayes is currently collaborating with the Carolinas Simulation Center on a research study examining ways to improve student performance. In addition, she has effectively established a working relationship with the Allegro Foundation, a program in the school system that works with children with disabilities. This has created a community partnership that benefits both the children at Allegro and the students at Carolinas College. Ms. Hayes is an excellent academic advisor who develops a working relationship with students, striving to know who they are as individuals, understanding both their potential strengths and weaknesses.

Finally, Ms. Hayes continually demonstrates enthusiasm for finding ways for all teammates of the college to come together outside of work to get to know one another and have fun, assisting in organizing a teammate get together at the Whitewater Center as well as an Escape Room activity for team building.

BLS Online Program. Cost \$28.50 (Online payment required - cannot register via brochure.) Access the American Heart Association website by typing in the web address: www.onlineaha.org. Choose HeartCode BLS. The course takes approximately two hours and must be taken before attending the Heartcode BLS Online Skills Check. The test has to be completed in one sitting. Print the Course Completion Certificate to bring to Heartcode BCLS Online Skills Check Part 2.

BCLS for the Healthcare Provider. June 12, 8 AM to noon. Cost \$50. Textbook not included. This course is designed for professional rescuers or students required to have professional rescuer certification for their healthcare program of study. The course provides information on adult and pediatric CPR, two-rescuer scenarios, use of the bagvalve mask, foreign-body airway obstruction (conscious and unconscious), AED, special resuscitation situations, and other cardiopulmonary emergencies.
