CLINICAL LABORATORY SCIENCE STUDENTS HOST PATCH PROGRAM

On Saturday February 17, the CCHS clinical laboratory science students in the histotechnology and medical laboratory science programs hosted students in the PATCH program (see picture above). PATCH stands for Propelling Adolescents Towards Careers in Healthcare. The CCHS students spent two hours with the PATCH high school sophomores explaining careers in laboratory science including lab demonstrations and hands-on experiences. This is just one way the HTL and MLS students are involved in promoting their profession and giving back to the community.

NURSING PROGRAM ACES ACCREDITATION VISIT

The Nursing program successfully completed its ACEN accreditation visit. The program was found to be in compliance with all six standards. The program received no recommendations and was noted to have several strengths, including excellent NCLEX pass rates and job placement rates as well as strong partnerships with Atrium Health and the Carolinas Simulation Center. The site visitors will recommend affirmation of accreditation with a review in eight years. The results of this site visit are preliminary results. The Evaluation Review Panel will convene in May to review the findings and then the Board of Commissioners will meet in July. The program will receive official notification in August regarding the reaccreditation.

COMPLIANCE UPDATE - Contact Precautions

This month's compliance corner involves a hospital process change based on quality improvement metrics, and a desire for continued surveillance for infection. Carolinas Medical Center (CMC) has had a longstanding policy with regard to the use of contact precautions for patients with Methicillin Resistant Staphylococcus Aureus (MRSA). The hospital has also been engaging in efforts to increase hand hygiene compliance among their healthcare workers. To this end, CMC has reported meeting the 2017 fourth quarter goal of 77% compliance with hand hygiene hospital-wide against a benchmark of 75%. In light of this accomplishment, on February 21, 2018, the hospital began a Contact Precautions Exclusion Trial. This means that for healthcare workers engaging with patients who are positive for MRSA, contact precautions will not be required. It is important to note that MRSA screening and decolonization will continue as per policy. For healthcare workers caring for patients with MRSA, the emphasis for daily care is on continued and consistent hand hygiene and use of Standard Precautions. The goal for Carolinas Medical Center is to maintain or exceed the established benchmark thereby increasing healthcare worker compliance while decreasing the spread of infection. It is also everyone's responsibility to speak up and remind others who do not comply. Remember also, this involves only Carolinas Medical Center and only MRSA at this time. Contact precautions required for other drug resistant organisms must be observed.
