NURSE AIDE PROGRAM CLOSING

Carolinas College of Health Sciences has long been a provider of quality non-credit/continuing education programs and workshops. However, effective **April 1, 2018**, Carolinas College will no longer offer Nurse Aide 1 or Nurse Aide 2 classes. Central Piedmont Community College (CPCC) has Nurse Aide offerings. CHS ADOPTS SECURITY CHANGES

In the past, students were told not to wear their system ID badge when walking through the hospital in street clothes. CHS Corporate Security, Central Division has now implemented stricter rules, to ensure everyone's safety, for all teammates regarding ID badges. You are now required to wear your badge **AT ALL TIMES** while on any CHS property, even if wearing street clothes. CHS Security Safety Officers will stop anyone who doesn't have a system ID badge clearly visible.



COMPLIANCE UPDATE - Joint Commission

Several years ago, Carolinas HealthCare System (CHS) began a collaborative effort with CCHS to enhance students' knowledge about the Joint Commission accreditation process. The Joint Commission (TJC) accredits and certifies about 20,000 healthcare organizations in the United States to acknowledge a high standard of quality care. The group does periodic visits to survey accredited healthcare institutions across the country to be sure the standard is being maintained. The rationale for the collaboration between CHS and CCHS is to educate nurses about the need and requirements of certification prior to entering practice with the hope that they begin their employment with accreditation in focus.

Senior nursing students in NUR 202 are required to attend a presentation by Carrie Fortier, an accreditation coordinator, and are presented with the information and forms required to do a mock survey. Since mock surveys are a good way for the hospital to "spot check" their compliance, they provide a good opportunity for both the hospital and our student nurses. The class is divided into groups and each group assigned to a unit. When the survey is complete, the students compile the data they collected and place it on a poster board. Strong and weak areas are identified. The presentation board is brought to the unit and posted for the staff to review. The staff can then make adjustments as needed to be best prepared for the next TJC survey.

BCLS for the Healthcare Provider February 14, 8 a.m. to noon. Cost \$50. Textbook not included. This course is designed for professional rescuers or students required to have professional rescuer certification for their healthcare program of study. The course provides information on adult and pediatric CPR, two-rescuer scenarios, use of the bag-valve mask, foreign-body airway obstruction (conscious and unconscious), AED, special resuscitation situations, and other cardiopulmonary emergencies.
