FACULTY MEMBER RECEIVES PRESTIGIOUS LUNA TRAVEL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Charlotte, NC – M. Lamar Jones, Histologist and Education Coordinator of the Histotechnology program at Carolinas College was the 2013 recipient of the Lee G. Luna Foreign Travel Scholarship Award. This scholarship, presented annually to a National Society for Histotechnology member, provides funds to visit a foreign country to participate in both learning and presenting a topic relevant to Histotechnology and Pathology.

Mr. Jones will travel to the Institute of Pathology at the University of Cologne Medical Center in Germany where he will study molecular techniques such as DNA extraction from paraffin embedded tissue sections, high resolution melting analysis and sequencing techniques. "This is a great honor to be selected by my peers for this prestigious award and to have the opportunity to study in Germany," stated Mr. Jones. He plans to incorporate basic molecular techniques into the Histotechnology program at the College upon his return.

The Histotechnology program, which admitted the first class in 2013, had a 100% graduation and placement rate for this first cohort of graduates. College Provost, Dr. Janice Terrell stated "Mr. Jones is an exceptional educator who is well respected in his field as evidenced by his nomination and selection for this award. Everyone at the College is proud of his accomplishment and of the excellent program he has built."
