He was the first college participant in the Pulse Weekend. The Pulse Weekend is a three-day experience that takes medical students and students from Carolinas College through various acute care settings.

As a student nurse, it showed me how vitally necessary communication is in healthcare. Reporting detailed information is paramount to providing the best care possible for the patient."

The goal of the Pulse Weekend is to give students an opportunity to experience acute care and recovery across the various departments and systems of the hospital. Starting from the Emergency Department at Carolinas Medical Center, Carolinas College students are paired with a third-year medical student for the weekend experience. This multi-disciplinary observation team will select an acutely ill medical or surgical patient, join the admitting team and follow the patient through the weekend and hospital stay. The CCHS student sees healthcare through the lens of a single patient, meeting the family and every member of the care team.
