What is the 2026 Qualitative Research Bootcamp?

A **4.5-day in-person training workshop** that is comprised of 15 modules on qualitative research topics. The workshop combines didactic and interactive learning approaches to create a comprehensive and hands-on learning experience.

When & where is the bootcamp held?

The bootcamp will be held **April 20-24, 2026** at the Innovation Quarter Campus in Winston-Salem, NC (525 Vine St.).

Who can apply?

Clinicians and trainees (Doctoral students, postdocs, residents, fellows, etc.) and faculty at any rank who are Wake Forest University School of Medicine, Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist, Atrium Health, or Levine Cancer Institute affiliates/employees.

Those selected are expected to attend the full 4-day bootcamp. The final half day is optional and will focus on individualized support.

Applicants with **cancer-related projects will be prioritized**, but all subject areas are encouraged to apply.

Is there a fee associated with the bootcamp?

There is a **\$1,200 fee** for the bootcamp, which covers participation in the week long intensive, bootcamp materials, and access to additional resources online. Daily lunch, snacks, and parking will be provided.

What will be covered?

The training will include an overview of qualitative methodology and rigorous study design, qualitative data collection, and qualitative data analysis.

- We will go through every stage of data collection from tool development, to conducting interviews and focus groups, through to how to manage the data that you collect.
- You will also learn about various analysis techniques, including traditional and rapid analysis, how to develop and use a codebook, and how to develop themes from your coded data.
- We will share various qualitative data analysis softwares that you can explore for your projects needs.
- Finally, you will be exposed to effective and engaging ways to disseminate your qualitative findings.

How will I benefit from the bootcamp?

The bootcamp will enhance qualitative research skills for currently funded projects and support applicants to submit qualitative proposals in the future.
