- A proposed research project relevant to pathways to physical disability, muscle function, body composition, neurologic substrates of physical function, translation of insights from biology of aging, or novel applications of functional assessments to improve patient care
- Commitment to a research career with an aging focus
- Sufficient protected time (≥50%) dedicated to research and career development activities
- Letter of support from Department Chair / Section Head

Selection Process:

- Applicants whose proposed project aligns with the Wake Forest Pepper Center research themes (based on LOI) will be invited to submit a full application
- Applications are reviewed by three reviewers
- Endorsement by the Pepper Center Executive Committee
