Most resources provided such as the voucher award are geared toward supporting community members, representatives of community organizations, providers, investigators, and research teams with the overarching goal of increasing research access and participation.

Your research matters! The program provides financial support that promotes the recruitment of study populations by making funds available to address essential needs such as transportation, caregiving (including childcare and elder care), study advertisement and other critical social support services.

Who Can Apply?

- Academic Faculty Researchers who hold faculty rank across the Southeast region of Advocate Health. This includes Atrium Health, Atrium Health Navicent, and Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist, including Wake Forest University School of Medicine.
- Wake Forest University (Reynolda Campus) faculty and all CTSI affiliated institutions with Wake Forest co-investigators.

Eligibility Criteria

The Voucher Award Program supports projects and studies that involve:

- Research that focuses on target study populations with historically low research involvement and participation.
- Research projects needing financial support aimed at increasing research access, participation, and retention of study population.
- Investigators with immediate needs and those who have used the voucher program less than three times will receive priority funding.

Applications are accepted quarterly on a rolling basis.
