The Voucher Award Funding Supports:



Childcare and elder care support.



Transportation assistance for participants (e.g., gas cards, public transit passes, rideshare, etc.).



Advertisements for study recruitment.



Translation services for research materials (including surveys, informed consent forms, and other participant-facing documents)



Other necessary social or logistical expenses essential to participation.

Who Can Apply?



Academic Faculty Researchers who hold faculty rank across the Southeast region of Advocate Health. This includes Atrium Health, Atrium Health Navicent, and Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist, including Wake Forest University School of Medicine.



Wake Forest University (Reynolda Campus) faculty and all CTSI affiliated institutions with Wake Forest co-investigators.

Eligibility Criteria

The Voucher Award Program supports projects and studies that involve:



Research that focuses on target study populations with historically low research involvement and participation.



Research projects needing financial support aimed at increasing research access, participation, and retention of study population.



Investigators who have received voucher award funding fewer than three times will receive priority.

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.
