



Catalog Addendum

The following information has changed since the 2012-13 Cabarrus College catalog was published.

P. 16: The immunization requirements for all incoming students were updated as follows:

North Carolina law requires all students entering undergraduate or graduate studies for the first time at any public or private college or university in North Carolina must provide proof of the following immunizations: Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (3 doses, one within the past ten years); polio (3 doses; only if under the age of 18); Measles (2 doses); Mumps (2 doses); rubella; and Hepatitis B (3 doses). Cabarrus College of Health Sciences requires (in addition to the state required immunizations): Varicella (chicken pox); and Two-Step TB Skin Test (must be administered within six months prior to the start of the first day of the semester for new students and updated annually).

P. 114: The course prefix, number, name, and description changed for **BIO 216** and are now the following:

NTR 210 - Nutrition across the Life Span

Nutrition is the study of how nutrients and food components function at molecular, cellular, and whole-body levels to impact human health and disease. Nutritional requirements and related health concerns of pregnant and lactating women, infants, children, adults and geriatric population are studied in relation to the physiological and metabolic aspects of pregnancy, lactation, growth and development, maintenance of health, prevention of disease, and aging. Prerequisite: Biology 210. Corequisite: Biology 220. 3 hours theory. Credit: 3 hours. This course is offered online.

EFFECTIVE: Spring 2013 Semester (January 7, 2013)

P. 128: **NSG401** has been combined with **NSG410**. See course description for **NSG410** below.

P. 129: The course title, description and credit hours changed for **NSG410** and are now the following:

NSG410 – Health and Populations and Service Learning Project

This course focuses on nursing management of culturally diverse individuals, families, and aggregates within communities. There is an emphasis on health-promotion, risk reduction, population-based care and epidemiology. The practicum experience in the course provides the student the opportunity to gain additional theoretical knowledge and to apply community health nursing concepts and principles. Learning experiences are individualized and guided by selected preceptor and course faculty. Prerequisites: NSG300, NSG301, NSG303, NSG305, NSG313. 3 hours theory. Credit: 7 hours. This course is web based and clinical.

Effective: Spring 2013 Semester (January 7, 2013)

P. 136: The course prefix, number and description changed for **SPH201** and are now the following:

COM201 - Communication in Business and Professional Life

In this course students examine the basic writing process and interpersonal communication skills needed to prepare effective professional business communication for audiences inside and outside the business environment. Prerequisite: ENG101. Credit: 3 hours.

P. 127: The corequisite information for NSG300 has been updated.

NSG 300 - Nursing in Society

This course examines the evolution of professional nursing, the health care system and health care trends influencing nursing practice. This course explores functions, interdisciplinary relationships and the future role of professional nursing. Prerequisite or Corequisite: CAS 302, Admission to BSN program. 3 hours theory. Credit: 3 hours. This course is offered in a web-based format. Offered in the fall and spring semesters.

Effective: Spring 2013 Semester (January 7, 2013)

P. 75: The BSN Completion Degree admissions information was updated with additional information, as follows below:

In some instances, the BSN Completion program may choose to accept students conditionally. A student accepted into the program as a conditional acceptance must meet the following criteria:

- must carry a minimum of 6 credit hours in the first semester
- maintain a 3.0 for the first semester in all program courses
- full accept after first semester if meets these requirements

If the student does not meet these criteria, the student will be withdrawn from the program.
