Lindsay Belden, MSN, RN, associate degree nursing faculty since 2008, was awarded her master of science in nursing from the University of Alabama at Birmingham. Her academic program had an emphasis on advanced practitioner of nursing training, focusing on advanced adult and primary care nurse practitioner training. Belden, a registered nurse for more than 12 years, is currently an instructor for Mental Health Nursing.
