Foundations of Faith Community Nursing Course Offering

Concord, N.C. —Cabarrus College of Health Sciences and the CHS Faith Community Health Ministry are sponsoring a 34 hour course entitled *Foundations of Faith Community Nursing*. The workshop will be held from 8:15 am until 5:30 pm the week of November 12-16, 2012 at Cabarrus College of Health Sciences.

This course is designed for registered nurses interested in or currently working as a Faith Community Nurse in a paid or non-compensated model. The course is based on the standard curriculum endorsed by the International Parish Nurse Resource Center (IPNRC). Contact hours are approved by the ANCC. The course provides participants with knowledge needed to become an health advocate while providing intentional care of the spirit to members of a faith community. The curriculum is developed from a Judeo-Christian theological framework of care and applicable to and respectful of other faith traditions incorporating community, culture and diversity. The curriculum develops the nurse for a leadership role in collaborative health ministry and provides content to develop faith community nursing practice and individual spiritual growth. Faith Community Nursing is non-denominational and open to persons of all religions and faiths.

The mission of Faith Community Nursing/Parish Nursing defined by the IPNRC "is the intentional integration of the practice of faith with the practice of nursing so that people can achieve wholeness in, with, and through the community of faith in which parish nurses serve." It is the core "belief that health is a journey toward well being and is the interrelationship of body, mind, and spirit." The mission further supports that "Health is not merely the absence of disease. It is related to everything a person does, thinks, and feels; therefore parish nurses focus on the whole person as they promote wellness, disease prevention, health education, and healthy spirituality."

The cost is \$550 and includes educational materials, two Foundational Faith Community Nursing books, certificate of completion, a Faith Community Nurse stained glass pin with lavaliere from the IPNRC and daily lunch. Course content includes the history and philosophy of spiritualty; healing and wholeness; ethical and legal issues; documentation, communication and collaboration; health promotion; transforming life issues; beginning your ministry; and community—assessment, resources, advocacy and care coordination. The class is limited to 20 participants on a first come, first served basis—space is limited. The registration and payment deadline is Friday, November 2, 2012.

Facilitators of the course include Veronique Singerman, MSN, MAT, RN, Faculty with Cabarrus College of Health Sciences and Pam Hurley, RN, BSN, Director of Faith Community Health ministry at Carolinas Medical Center-NorthEast.
