What is Phlebotomy?:

Phlebotomy is the technique of obtaining blood for a vein or skin puncture for laboratory analysis, which aids in the patient's diagnosis. A person trained to perform phlebotomy procedures is called a phlebotomist or venipuncture technician.

Upon successful completion of this program, graduates will be awarded a certificate of completion and are eligible to take a national certifying examination. The testing fee for national certification is \$125.00. The salary range for phlebotomists is approximately \$20,000 - \$30,000 per year.

Phlebotomy Program Description:

Weeks 1-5: Classroom and student lab instruction (80 hours) teach skills needed for proper collection of blood. Emphasis is placed on ethics, legalities, medical terminology, safety and infection control, quality assurance, health care delivery systems, patient relations, anatomy and physiology and specimen collection/processing. Classes are held at Carolinas College of Health Sciences on the campus of Carolinas Medical Center in Charlotte, NC.

Weeks 6-10: Clinical experience (120 hours). Students visit a variety of healthcare settings within Carolinas Healthcare System* to develop skills necessary to perform successful phlebotomy procedures. Times, days, and locations will vary due to the availability of clinical sites. Students will go to a different site each week for 5 weeks to obtain a minimum of 150 successful venipunctures and 25 finger sticks.

*Clinical rotations will be in a variety of settings within Carolinas HealthCare System. Transportation is not provided.

Program Schedule:

Students should plan to commit 30-32 hours per week to the program. Final examinations and evaluations will be completed in the last week of the course.

Weeks 1-5: Classes are from 8:00 am – 12:00 noon on Monday -Thursday.

Weeks 6-10: Clinical practice. Times and days will vary during the clinical rotations.

HOW TO APPLY

PHASE I

- Attend an information session. Call 704-355-2663 to reserve a space. An academic assessment test * (12 minutes) and a manual dexterity test will be administered during this session. Detailed information about this program will be discussed. You must score 14 or higher on the assessment test and 60 seconds or less on the manual dexterity test to be considered for the program.
- Complete and bring with you to the session the CCHS application form and criminal background release form and \$20 non-refundable application/testing fee.
- Have your high school transcript or GED certificate mailed to your home. Bring your unopened transcript to your information session. Documented college grades (unopened transcript showing at least 12 successful semester hours of credit) can be used in lieu of a high school transcript. A minimum 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale will be evaluated.
- Due to limited resources in supporting international students and a focus on providing healthcare
 practitioners for the Charlotte metropolitan area, the College will not authorize requests for temporary or
 student visas. Proof of legal residency may be required.
- If English is not your native language, a TOEFL score of at least 220 (computer version) or 83 (iBT: Internet based) is required to process your application. Please contact www.toefl.org to schedule test or request scores. (CCHS school code 5130).

PHASE II

 Preliminary selection will be based on the most qualified individuals who complete Phase I of the admissions requirements

PHASE III

- Applicants who are notified of conditional acceptance will be required to have a negative drug screen.
 The drug screen will be conducted at no cost to the applicant
- Applicants are required to be cleared by Carolinas Healthcare System (CHS) for participation in clinical education. Applicants who are former employees of CHS must be eligible for rehire.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

The following are functions that a student is required to have to successfully participate in this course:

- o Critical thinking ability sufficient to organize responsibilities and make decisions
- o Interpersonal abilities sufficient to interact with individuals form a variety of backgrounds.
- o Communication abilities sufficient for interaction with others in verbal or written form
- o Gross and fine motor abilities to manipulate phlebotomy equipment to collect specimens
- o Visual ability sufficient to discern colors and perform phlebotomy procedures

OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

Applicants will need to schedule a drug screen, tuberculin skin test and Hepatitis B immunization with Employee Health (free of charge). An applicant's background check cleared by Carolinas Healthcare System (CHS) for participation in clinical education. Applicants who are former employees of CHS must meet clinical eligibility. Clinical experiences will be at various Carolinas Healthcare System sites. Transportation is not provided.
