Grace Hospital in Morganton, North Carolina was founded in 1906 as a mission of Grace Episcopal Church. In 1999, Grace and Valdese hospitals came together to form Blue Ridge HealthCare (BRHC). Together, Grace and Valdese hospitals provide complementary acute care services in a system that also includes two long-term/short-term care rehabilitation centers, a medically based wellness center, home health, a continuing care retirement community, and a medical group comprised of primary care physicians and specialists with practices in a three-county area.

Grace Hospital is home to BRHC's Women's Center, a Level III neonatal nursery, Sanger Heart & Vascular Institute, orthopaedic services, gastroenterology services, rehabilitation services, MedCenter Air, and state-of-the-art surgery and imaging centers, including the Ladies Health Pavilion with outpatient diagnostic imaging dedicated to the special needs of women.
