**If you guessed C, you are correct!!** The college's accrediting organization, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC), reviews CCHS and its programs every 10 years. Being accredited is essential for the college to be recognized as a quality institution and provides benefits such as (1) eligibility for US federal student aid, (2) ability to sit for licensing exams, and (3) assurance for employers to know you graduated from a quality school.

One piece of the accreditation process is for the college to develop a plan, called a Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP), focused on an area of our students' education we would like to improve. For our QEP, we have chosen to focus on Interprofessional Education and Teamwork.

**So what does that mean for you?** We need your help in shaping the future – a future CCHS education that enable students to be effective interprofessional team members in the healthcare setting.

A first step is assessing what the College is presently doing to help our students gain the knowledge and skills needed to be that team member. So this summer on your end of course evaluations you will be asked several questions about your knowledge and participation in Interprofessional Education and Teamwork. Don't worry if you don't feel like you know much at this time. We are just trying to understand what our students already know. The results will help us flesh out our plan, which will be reviewed by SACSCOC this fall.

**BLS Online Program.** Cost \$28.50 (Online payment required - cannot register via brochure.) Access the American Heart Association website by typing in the web address: <a href="www.onlineaha.org">www.onlineaha.org</a>. Choose HeartCode BLS. The course takes approximately two hours and must be taken before attending the Heartcode BLS Online Skills Check. The test has to be completed in one sitting. Print the Course Completion Certificate to bring to Heartcode BCLS Online Skills Check Part 2.

**BCLS for the Healthcare Provider. July 17,** 8 AM to noon. Cost \$50. Textbook not included. This course is designed for professional rescuers or students required to have professional rescuer certification for their healthcare program of study. The course provides information on adult and pediatric CPR, two-rescuer scenarios, use of the bagvalve mask, foreign-body airway obstruction (conscious and unconscious), AED, special resuscitation situations, and other cardiopulmonary emergencies.
