CYNDIE HOBSON - OUTSTANDING EDUCATOR FOR 2018

Cyndie Hobson, microbiology instructor for the medical laboratory science program, received her BS from UNC-Wilmington. In her third year of college, she was offered a seat in the School of Medical Technology at Charlotte Memorial Hospital, an internship for college-affiliated students to supplement their degree with 45 credit hours in laboratory science training. Two years after graduating, she was asked to teach in the Medical Technology program. In 1996, the program moved to the College when the School of Clinical Laboratory Sciences merged with all other allied health programs at Carolinas Medical Center.

As an educator, Cyndie effectively balances delivering rigorous content while effectively supporting her students in the course. She always makes time for her students, both in and outside of the classroom. In addition, she is a good communicator and an advocate for the program and the profession. One student noted, "Cyndie has been one of the most influential educators I have encountered at this college. Cyndie also educates us on the past and the pathway to where we are now and where we will be in the future. She explicitly tells the expectations of professionals in general and expectations in the laboratory. She is an outstanding educator and an even better person. She puts her students first and is truly here because she loves teaching and creating professionals of

the future." Always willing to try something new, Cyndie has worked diligently in recent years to continue to keep her course content current while integrating new technologies into her teaching. She has spent time and effort in "flipping" her classrooms so that students come to class prepared to engage in active learning techniques...a helpful strategy when trying to understand the complex topics within microbiology. Consistently described as "very interactive and engaging," Cyndie continuously evaluates the best ways to engage students in her course. Her clear passion for her course, her students, and her profession is evident and a strong positive influence on her students.

Personally, Cyndie is active in her church, works with the youth, and has taken leadership roles within her church helping serve the ministry of the Salvation Army Center of Hope for Women. Cyndie and husband Clark have two daughters, Chandler and Cameron. As a two-time cancer survivor, Cyndie brings a sense of life and energy to anything of which she is a part. Cyndie has been recognized numerous times within her profession and is celebrating her 40th work anniversary with Atrium Health this year. PULSE WEEKEND OPPORTUNITY

To deepen teamwork, inter-professionalism, and patient-centered care, Carolinas College students can participate in a "PULSE Weekend" throughout the year. Paired with a third-year medical student for the weekend, the Carolinas College student follows a single ED patient for three days, from arrival at the emergency department on Friday evening through triage, emergency procedure, consults, hospital admission and rounding by the care team on Saturday and Sunday mornings. The Carolinas College student sees healthcare through the lens of a single patient, meeting the family and every member of the care team. Several days later, the student participates in a debrief meeting with the medical student and other members of the medical education division to discuss their observations and lessons learned. Feedback from medical students who recently participated in a PULSE weekend has been overwhelming positive with regards to Carolinas College students:

- Working with a partner for pulse weekend was a great experience, and I could not have asked for a better partner. She is an entering nursing student that has been working with patients as a CNA for a couple of years, but this was one of her first experiences in a hospital other than accompanying family members. Overall, I thoroughly enjoyed working with my pulse partner and know she will be great as a nurse or further if she decides.
- Throughout this journey, I was paired with a pre-nursing student. This assignment was voluntary for him, and he seemed very excited to learn about how things work in the hospital. Prior to this experience, my partner had never been inside of a hospital except to visit family members. Given his newness to the medical field, he served as another person who was still very close to a patient's perspective. He was a great bridge between my small amount of knowledge about how teams manage patients and our patient's point of view.
- In addition to the insightful patient care experience, the opportunity to work with other allied health students was enriching. I had scarce interactions with other allied health students since starting medical school. I was also unfamiliar with the programs within CMC for nursing and allied health. Working with her gave me an insight into the roles and perspective of the individuals whose work I depend on every day, but whose paths I hardly cross. In a system where roles depend on each other, neither of us knew the extent of training or expertise of others. It was a truly unique opportunity to learn from her, and I would embrace other opportunities to collaborate with other allied health students.

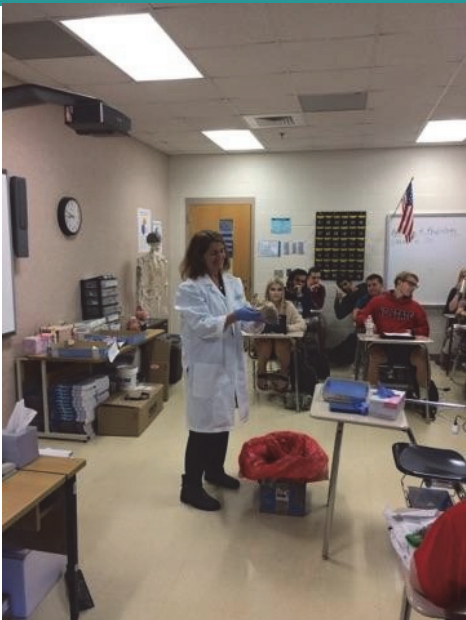
