**Heartcode BLS Online Program** Cost \$28.50 (Online payment required - cannot register via brochure.) Access the American Heart Association website by typing in the web address: [www.onlineaha.org](http://www.onlineaha.org). Choose HeartCode BLS. The course takes approximately two hours and must be taken before attending the Heartcode BLS Online Skills Check. The test has to be completed in one sitting. Print the Course Completion Certificate to bring to Heartcode BLS Online Skills Check Part 2.

This course is designed for professional rescuers or students required to have professional rescuer certification for their healthcare program of study. ## COMPLIANCE UPDATE - Sharps Safety

In May of last year, Atrium Health issued a safety alert regarding Sharps Bin containers. Several reports indicated that Sharps Bins had been tampered with in the clinical areas which defeats the purpose of this safety container. The risk of inadvertent sticks with contaminated sharps still exists. Contents of the sharps container have been noted in patient rooms, among patient belongings, on stretchers and in regular garbage cans. In light of the recent increase in sticks, it seems appropriate to remind everyone of the following:



- It is imperative that all teammates/students follow the CHS Medication Administration Policy regarding disposal of controlled substances and sharps.
- If a dose is not used in its entirety, it must be wasted with a witness to prevent the unintended use of the remaining drug.
- Safety sharps bins must be anchored by a bracket and kept in a secure location.
- Keep all sharps and syringes secure, and do not place syringes with remaining controlled substances in sharps bins.
- If there is any evidence that a patient has tampered with a sharps bin, notify CHS Security. You can also document it in Canopy with an "at risk to harm" alert.
- Be vigilant for sharp objects when changing linens and when touching patient items.

Sharps Bin containers are one of many tools in use to keep teammates/students safe from harm. Be sure to follow policy for their use.
